GERD LEONHARD

Futurist, Humanist, Author, Film Maker, Speaker

Listed by Wired Magazine as one of the top 100 most influential people in Europe (2015), Gerd's work focusses on the future of humanity and technology, digital ethics, artificial intelligence, future-leadership and communications.

Gerd is not just a leading expert on the future, he is also a humanist who believes that all scientific and technological progress should further collective human flourishing. In his opening keynote speech he reflects what it means to be human in a world of machines and algorithms, the coming redefinition of human-machine relationships, the future of work and jobs and many more.

Perttu Pölönen has been given many titles, such as inventor, author, composer, keynote speaker, futurist and visionaire. He still prefers not to use titles at all – it's difficult to put him into any known box.

Perttu is a classically trained composer by education, but became an entrepreneur at a young age. Perttu has studied at Singularity University, a think tank located at the NASA Ames Research Center in California. While in California, he co-founded a non-profit, 360ed, that develops AR apps for the education sector in developing countries – the company is run and operated in Myanmar. Perttu's own invention, a device for teaching music theory called MusiClock, is an example of how a personal challenge can be turned into an internationally awarded and patented invention. It received first prize in the biggest science fair in Europe, the European Union's Competition for Young Scientists. In 2018 MIT Tech Review honored him among 35 Innovators Under 35 in Europe.

Perttu has written two books: Future Skills (2020) and Future Identities (2021). Perttu is known as an inspiring thinker who believes that human skills and values will be crucially important in the future, to balance technological advancements.

Antonio is a strong advocate of the importance of recruiter and candidate experience – a firm believer in the need of humanizing recruitment, even in the times of bots and machine learning. Focus topics are global virtual collaboration, digitalization and implementation of green technologies in education. He also promotes and establishes Dual Study Programs like – "Lehre mit Studium".

Friedrich knows VET from both ends as trainer and as a learner. In 2006 he joined Siemens Germany as a dual student purchasing an Electrician Operation Technician Certificate and Bachelor of Science in Mechatronics and Automation. Friedrich has an extensive history as Academic Advisor and Technical Trainer for Siemens. In previous roles he advised Siemens Business Units and Regional Companies on international education projects. Together with Ministries and education providers he initiated, designed and implemented new training programs in Australia, Argentina, Nigeria.

André Burri is Official Delegate of SwissSkills as well as Managing Director of the Foundation SwissSkills, SwissSkills Marketing & Events as well as of the Association SwissSkills Bern. Before holding those positions, he acquired his practical background at diverse companies, starting off as Food and Beverage Manager and Sales and Marketing Manager in some hotels in Prague and Basel. Later, his professional career led him to well-known companies, such as the Casino Kursaal in Interlaken, metazona in Bern, BERNEXPO or Migros Aare, where he held leading positions.

In the USA, he managed to build up a 4-year apprenticeship training for his company's division and, both at the headquarter in Austria and the division in the USA, he was responsible for training the best students for skills competitions over decades. Today, he is primarily responsible for recruiting and selecting students – approximately 400 apprentices. In addition to that, one of Gernoth's responsibility is the management of skills competitions at Blum GmbH. Gernoth will give deep and very practical insights by showing ways, what companies can do to push talents of their young people and how they can train, motivate and lead their highly skilled employees to top performances and international success
